- ... Take in the views from Glacier Point in Yosemite. It's the best place to see the park's most famous landmarks all at once.
- ... Lake Tahoe boasts some of the country's best ski resorts, where local pint-size boardriders often grow up to become gold medal winners.
- ... Zip-line through the redwood trees in Sonoma County, keeping an eye out for the plethora of wildlife in the branches and down below.
- ... Join a ranger-led night sky program in Joshua Tree National Park for a guided tour of stars, planets, constellations and glittering galaxies.
- ... Soak in a natural bubbling hot spring in Mammoth Lakes. Finding them requires a bit of a treasure hunt, so be sure to ask for directions at the Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center.

When you go to California, go hungry. Amazing and innovative chefs work with farms and artisanal food purveyors to source the best local and fresh ingredients in order to create magic on your plate.

- ... San Francisco has some of the nation's best produce at their fingertips. With more three Michelin-starred restaurants than New York, chefs in the 'City by the Bay' create plenty of edible magic. One stop where you'll definitely find something delicious to graze on is the Ferry Building Marketplace. Here, permanent booths sell local delicacies like crusty sourdough and artisanal cheese.
